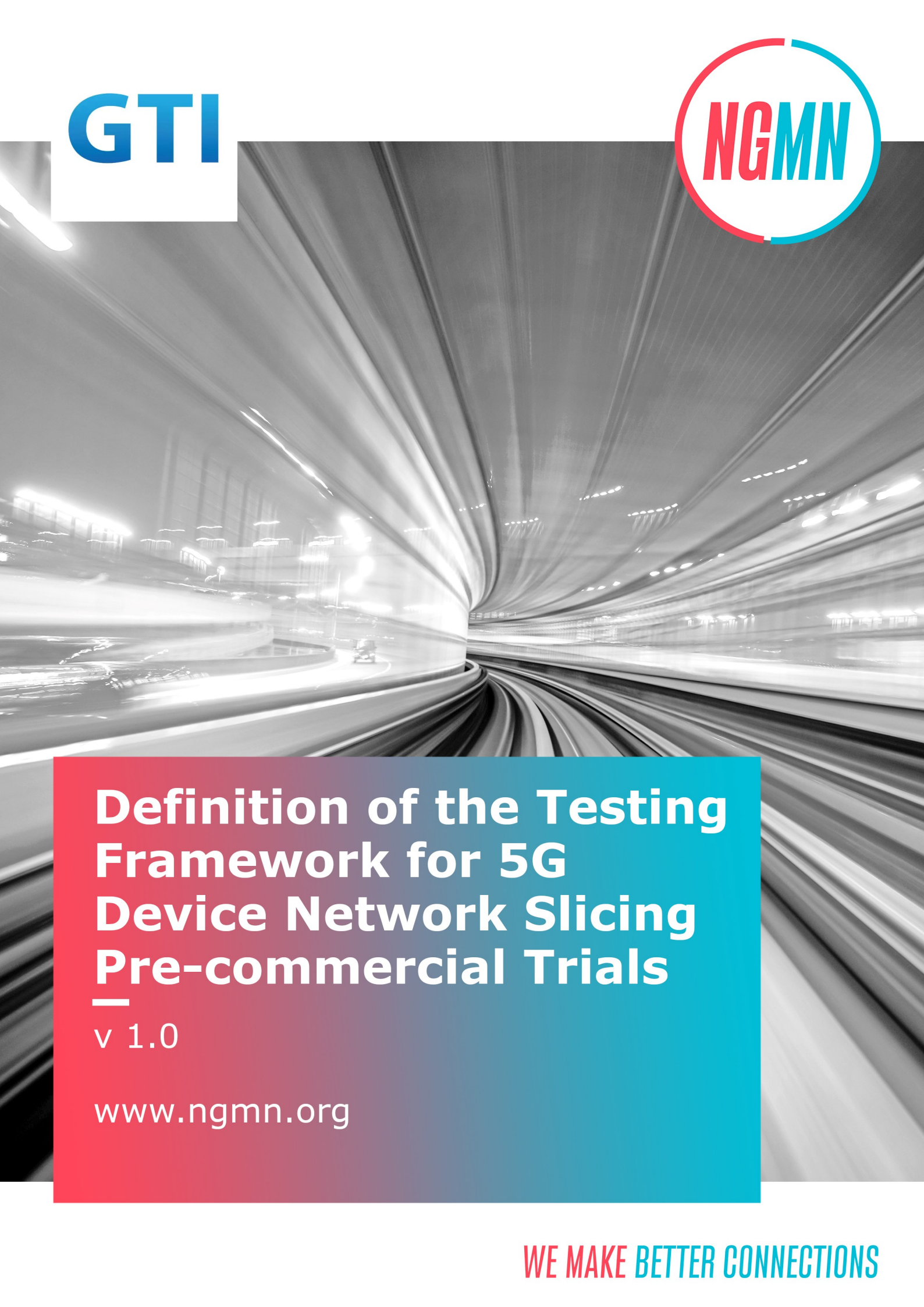

Definition of the Testing Framework for 5G Device Network Slicing Pre-commercial Trials

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DEFINITION OF THE TESTING FRAMEWORK FOR 5G DEVICE NETWORK SLICING PRE-COMMERCIAL TRIALS

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Abstract

The 5G network slicing can provide on-demand network slices to satisfy different service requirements. However, how to guarantee the network slicing service quality of 5G devices by the network slicing test based on the actual network elements is still a technical gap to be addressed.

Therefore, the fundamental purpose of this document is to provide a testing framework for 5G device network slicing pre-commercial trials based on the actual network elements, which include the test cases of the configuration and usage of NSSAI, UE route selection policy, interworking with EPC and other service specific network slicing test cases.

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1 INTRODUCTION

The NGMN Network Slicing for Operating Systems of 5G Smart Phones project was kicked off in 2020. After more than half a year of research and analysis, the “5G Smart Devices Supporting Network Slicing” White Paper [1] was published jointly with GTI in January 2021. Based on this White Paper, NGMN sends a Liaison to 3GPP RAN5 to stress the importance of the network slicing testing. Although a new Work Item on UE Conformance Test Aspects for Enhancement of Network Slicing and a new Study Item on 5G NR UE supporting Network Slicing Testing have been endorsed by RAN5, what is discussed and analysed in RAN5 is still the conformance test of network slicing by test equipment.

Some tests, such as network slicing tests based on the actual network elements, are not included in 3GPP RAN5. But these tests are still necessary to ensure the commercial success of network slicing. Furthermore, the industry has a demand for network slicing testing, and UE vendors and network providers are capable doing the network slicing test. Therefore, it is necessary to perform the network slicing testing in NGMN and GTI based on the actual network elements, which will provide valuable feedback and input to 3GPP and the industry.

The project focuses on the Network Slicing Trials based on the actual network elements, and has the following scope:

- Developing a testing framework for 5G Network Slicing Devices, which allows the harmonisation of the testing methodologies among different parties conducting trials;
- Testing 5G Network slicing capabilities by lab test/field trials with different kinds of devices, e.g. smartphones, modem;
- Consolidating the results from different industry players and drawing conclusions. Analysing the testing conclusions and bringing observations that could lead to future improvement.

The main purpose of the project is to assess the functionality and performance of Network Slicing implementation in 5G Devices based on Release 15 and forward of the 5G NR standardisation by lab test/field trials, so as to ensure the user experience.

2 SCOPE

This framework document is structured in three parts:

1. Trial setup requirements
2. Common requirements for network slicing trial
3. Service specific requirements for network slicing trial

The trial setup requirements section introduces the trial environment requirements, such as the network architecture and configuration, the test tool requirements, and the reporting requirements.

The common requirements for network slicing trial section define the test cases of network slicing in 5G devices, such as the configuration and usage of NSSAI, UE Route Selection Policy and Interworking with EPC. Each test case includes the test objective, pre-configuration, test procedure and success criteria.

The service specific requirements for network slicing trial section defines the service performance tests of network slicing in 5G devices, such as the video service, the cloud gaming service and FTP/speedtest download service. Each test case includes the test objective, pre-configuration, test procedure and success criteria for specific services.

3 TRIAL SETUP REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Network Architecture and Configuration

The pre-commercial network slicing trials will primarily aim at testing network slicing in 5G devices using actual network elements to reflect the functionality and performance of devices in a more realistic environment for more meaningful results.

The network slicing trials in this project are different from the 5G pre-commercial trials. The 5G pre-commercial trials focus on whether the performance parameters, such as latency, user throughput, cell capacity, and coverage, meet the requirements. The 5G device network slicing trials in this project focus on the signalling aspect and whether the network and device can successfully deal with the configuration of NSSAI, the UE route selection policy and the interworking with EPC. The deployment scenarios are not main considerations in this version of the document and need to be determined according to the actual test environment.

The 5G device network slicing trial is an end-to-end test. The test environment requires the cells/sites, core network, UEs and signalling analysis tools. The site needs to be a 5G NR site so that the UE can access the core network through this NR site. The core network should be a 5G core network, and its network elements -- AMF, SMF, PCF, NSSF and others need to have the ability to support network slicing (which is mandatory per 3GPP Rel-15 specifications).

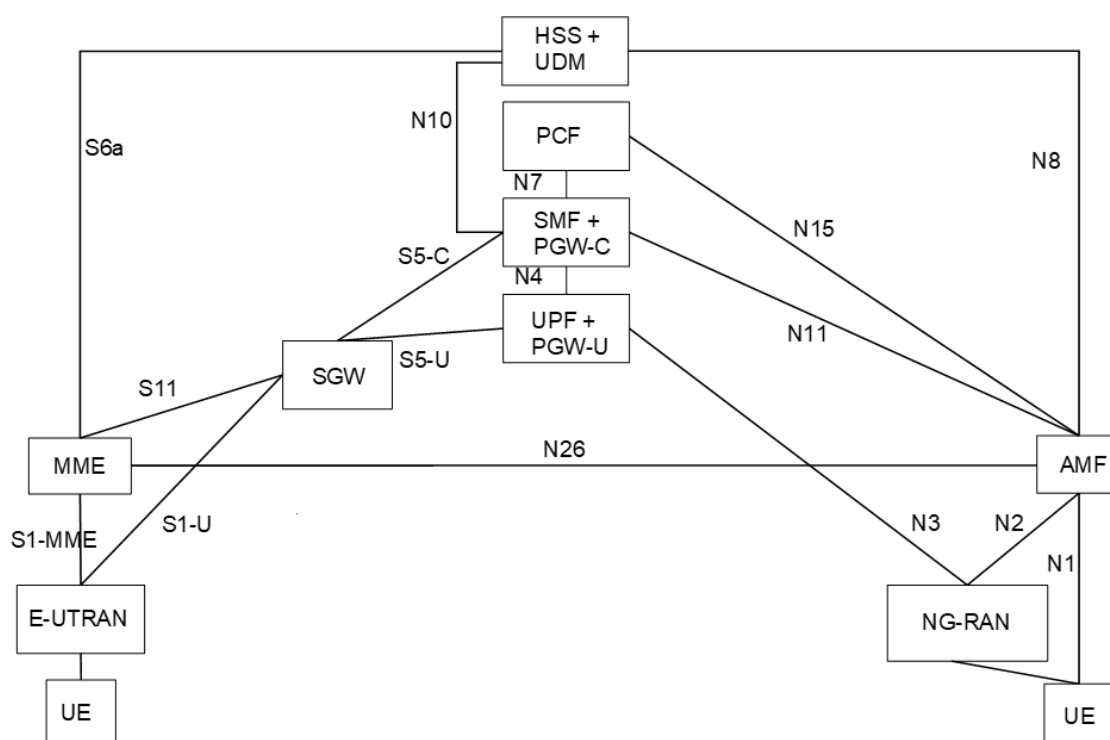


Figure 1: Overall Architecture

The UEs used in this trial are test UEs, not commercial UEs. For this trial, the test UEs include the smart UEs and non-smart UEs. The smart UEs include the smartphones and other devices with operating systems, while the non-smart UEs include the Modem and CPEs.

The requirement of the number of cells/sites will vary in different test cases. For test cases related to NSSAI and URSP scenarios, one NR site is sufficient. For test cases related to interworking with EPC, at least two sites are required, i.e. one for NR and one for LTE.

3.2 Test Tool Requirements

In order to observe whether the UE can successfully handle the configuration of NSSAI, the UE route selection policy and the interworking with EPC for signalling aspects, this test requires the vendors to provide appropriate signalling analysis tools to analyse NAS layer signalling, and an appropriate tool to simulate APPs or real APP.

3.3 Test Report Requirements

The trial reporting is a very important phase for the trial. In order to provide analytically valuable test results, it is necessary to provide a benchmark for the test cases for the comparison of test results. Hence, contributors are encouraged to provide as many details as possible about their trials. The following aspects need to be covered in the trial reporting.

1. Trial setup information

The following deployment parameters need to be reported for each trial:

- Frequency band
 - Operating bandwidth
 - Number of sites
 - Type of test UEs (smartphones, modem, CPE...)
 - Network elements (RAN, core network.....)
 -
2. Trial result information
Contributors are required to provide test results related information, including test log, test results analysis, etc.
3. Trial result benchmark
Defining the benchmarks to evaluate the performance of 5G network slicing is very crucial.
For the network slicing signalling test, using 5G NR Rel.15 as a benchmark is an option. For the network slicing performance test, the benchmark is the performance of the same kind of application without network slicing. Ideally, the benchmark is based on the same test environment/condition, such as the benchmark application has the same setup parameters and the same test environment with the test application. The only difference is that the test application is implemented in the specific network slice according to the UE subscription, while the benchmark application is implemented in the default network slice. However, the different test environment/condition between benchmark and test application could also be acceptable as long as the differences are well described.

4 COMMON REQUIREMENTS FOR NETWORK SLICING TRIAL

4.1 The Configuration and Usage of NSSAI

4.1.1 NSSAI Handling in Initial Registration

4.1.1.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify the UE can successfully perform the initial registration to the 5G system without/with Requested NSSAI and support of Configured NSSAI/Allowed NSSAI/Rejected NSSAI for network slicing.

4.1.1.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- Subscribed S-NSSAIs are configured for UE, the Configured NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) can be generated for UE.

UE:

- The test UICC with USIM should be inserted;
- UE has no stored allowed NSSAI for the current PLMN, no configured NSSAI for the current PLMN, and no default configured NSSAI;
- The UE is in state Switched OFF.

4.1.1.3 Test Procedure

1. Switch on UE;
2. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure;
3. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Configured NSSAI;
4. Switch off UE;
5. From network side, remove S-NSSAI-3 from the UE's subscription information in the UDM, so that the Allowed NSSAI (S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI2) and the Rejected NSSAI (S-NSSAI3) can be generated for the UE in this registration area;
6. Switch on UE;
7. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure;
8. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Allowed NSSAI and Rejected NSSAI;
9. Use MMI/AT command (+C5GNSSAIRDP) or other method to verify the Allowed NSSAI and Rejected NSSAI stored in UE;
10. Switch off UE, then switch on UE;
11. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure.

Note: The Allowed NSSAI is the intersection of the requested NSSAI, the NSSAI supported by the AMF, the NSSAI supported by the RAN, and the NSSAI subscribed by the UE.

4.1.1.4 Success Criteria

Step 2: UE performs initial registration without Requested NSSAI;

Step 7: UE performs initial registration with Requested NSSAI, which including the S-NSSAI(s) from the configured NSSAI (e.g. S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3);

Step 9: UE correctly stores the latest Allowed NSSAI (S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI2), Configured NSSAI (S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2) and Rejected NSSAI (S-NSSAI3);

Step 11: UE performs initial registration with Requested NSSAI, which including the S-NSSAI(s) from the allowed NSSAI (e.g. S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI2).

4.1.2 NSSAI Handling during Mobility Registration Update

4.1.2.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify the UE can successfully perform Mobility Registration Update procedure after reselecting a cell in a new Tracking Area outside its Registration Area, and the UE shall include the requested NSSAI containing the S-NSSAI(s) corresponding to the slices to which the UE intends to register.

4.1.2.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 2 cells, 5GC Cell A and 5GC Cell B belonging to the same Home PLMN but different RA;

- Subscribed S-NSSAIs are configured for UE, Allowed NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) and Configured NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) can be generated for UE.

UE:

- The test UICC with USIM should be inserted;
- The UE is in state Switched OFF.

4.1.2.3 Test Procedure

1. Only Cell A is ON, then switch on UE;
2. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure on Cell A;
3. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Allowed NSSAI and Configured NSSAI;
4. Cell B is ON, and let UE move from the service area of Cell A to Cell B;
5. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message for mobility registration update on Cell B.

4.1.2.4 Success Criteria

Step 5: UE performs registration procedure for mobility registration update with Requested NSSAI, which including the S-NSSAI(s) from the allowed NSSAI and configured NSSAI (e.g. S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3).

4.1.3 Default Configured NSSAI Pre-configuration and Update

4.1.3.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify the UE can transmit REGISTRATION REQUEST message with Requested NSSAI using the default configured NSSAI and also include Network slicing indication, while the default configured NSSAI can be pre-configured in UE and updated by NW.

4.1.3.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- No Subscribed S-NSSAI configured for UE.

UE:

- UE has no stored allowed NSSAI for the current PLMN, no configured NSSAI for the current PLMN, and no default configured NSSAI;
- The UE is in state Switched OFF.

4.1.3.3 Test Procedure

1. Switch on UE;
2. Via AT command or other method, UE is preconfigured with Default Configured NSSAI as S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI2, then switch off UE;
3. From network side, configure Subscribed S-NSSAIs for UE, so that the Allowed NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) and Configured NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) can be generated for UE;
4. Switch on UE;
5. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure;
6. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Allowed NSSAI and Configured NSSAI;
7. From network side, triggers the UE Parameter Update via UDM Control Plan procedure, to re-configure the default configured NSSAI as S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI3;
8. The UE acknowledgement of successful reception of the updated UE configuration parameter information is sent back to the network using the UE-initiated uplink NAS transport procedure;
9. Use MMI/AT command (+C5GNSSAIRDP) or other method to verify the update of the Default Configured NSSAI stored in UE.

4.1.3.4 Success Criteria

Step 5: UE sends REGISTRATION REQUEST message with Requested NSSAI using the default configured NSSAI (S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2) and also includes Network slicing indication;

Step 9: The Default Configured NSSAI stored in UE is updated successfully, i.e. S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI3.

4.1.4 Generic UE Configuration Update for NSSAI

4.1.4.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify the UE supports the generic UE configuration update procedure initiated by the network to update Configured NSSAI/Allowed NSSAI/rejected NSSAI.

4.1.4.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- Subscribed S-NSSAIs are configured for UE, Allowed NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) and Configured NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2 and S-NSSAI3) can be generated for UE.

UE:

- The test UICC with USIM should be inserted;
- The UE is in state Switched OFF.

4.1.4.3 Test Procedure

1. Switch on UE;
2. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure;
3. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Allowed NSSAI and Configured NSSAI;
4. From network side, initiates the Generic UE configuration update procedure, to update the UE with the new Configured NSSAI, Allowed NSSAI;
5. The UE sends a CONFIGURATION UPDATE COMPLETE message;
6. Use MMI/AT command (+C5GNSSAIRDP) or other method to verify the update of allowed NSSAI and rejected NSSAI.

4.1.4.4 Success Criteria

Step 5: UE sends a confirmation response "CONFIGURATION UPDATE COMPLETE" to NW;

Step 6: UE correctly stores the updated Allowed NSSAI (S-NSSAI1 and S-NSSAI2), Configured NSSAI (S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2) and Rejected NSSAI(S-NSSAI3).

4.1.5 NSSAI Inclusion Mode A

4.1.5.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify the UE supports NSSAI inclusion mode A indicated by NW.

4.1.5.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- Subscribed S-NSSAIs are configured for UE, Allowed NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2, S-NSSAI3, S-NSSAI4, S-NSSAI5 and S-NSSAI6) and Configured NSSAI (including S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI2, S-NSSAI3, S-NSSAI4, S-NSSAI5 and S-NSSAI6) can be generated for UE;
- Set the periodic registration update timer (T3512) to the minimum value.

UE:

- The test UICC with USIM should be inserted;
- The UE is in state Switched OFF.

4.1.5.3 Test Procedure

1. Switch on UE;
2. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure;
3. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message including Allowed NSSAI and Configured NSSAI, and the NSSAI inclusion mode IE is set to "NSSAI inclusion mode A";
4. Switch off UE, then Switch on UE;
5. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message to initiate the registration procedure, check the s-NSSAI-List in RRCSetupComplete message;
6. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message;
7. From network side, initiates a generic UE configuration update procedure by sending the CONFIGURATION UPDATE COMMAND to the UE with a request to perform the registration procedure;
8. The UE sends a CONFIGURATION UPDATE COMPLETE message;
9. Wait for NW releasing the existing N1 NAS signalling connection;
10. The UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message for mobility registration update, check the s-NSSAI-List in RRCSetupComplete message;
11. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message;
12. Wait for NW releasing the RRC connection due to user inactivity, UE is in 5GMM-IDLE mode;
13. Use setting menu or engineering mode or other method to change UE radio capability for NG-RAN, e.g. change the 5G mode from SA mode to SA+NSA mode, to trigger UE initiate the registration procedure for mobility registration update by sending a REGISTRATION REQUEST message, check the s-NSSAI-List in RRCSetupComplete message;
14. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message;
15. Wait for the periodic registration update timer (T3512) to expire, UE sends a REGISTRATION REQUEST message for periodic registration update, check the s-NSSAI-List in RRCSetupComplete message;
16. The NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message;
17. Initiate data transfer (Ping) on internet DNN, with the PDU session established on the default network slice (e.g. S-NSSAI1);
18. Stop any data transfer, wait for NW releasing the RRC connection due to user inactivity;
19. Initiate data transfer (Ping) on internet DNN, UE sends a SERVICE REQUEST message, check the s-NSSAI-List in RRCSetupComplete message.

4.2.2.4 Success Criteria

4.3.1.4 Success Criteria

UE selects specified PDU session for service by matching the URSP rule in NR and Handover from 5GC to EPC with PDU being mapped to PDN, the traffic keeps continuous for both APP:

Step 1: The "Mapped EPS bearer contexts" with EBI = ebi_number1 is included in the PDU SESSION ESTABLISHMENT ACCEPT message for the PDU session triggered by APP1, and "Mapped EPS bearer contexts" with EBI = ebi_number2 is included in the related accept message for the PDU session which the traffic of APP2 is transmitted in;

Step 4: "EPS bearer context status" is included in the EMM Tracking Area Update message and the EPS bear with ebi_number1 and EPS bear with ebi_number2 which set in step1 are indicated active;

Step 5: "EPS bearer context status" is included in the EMM Tracking Area accept message and the EPS bear with epi_number1 and EPS bear with ebi_number2 which set in step1 are indicated active;

Check if packets for APP1 and APP2 are transmitted and received over the corresponding PDN connections respectively.

4.3.2 Redirection from EPC to 5GC

4.3.2.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify 5G devices with traffic setup in LTE could be redirected from EPC to 5GC, and the data transmission is kept continuity.

Note: this case is designed with DNN based URSP rule as an example, and other Traffic Description also could be used.

4.3.2.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- The hardware platform is powered on and the working status is normal;
- LTE cell works normally, NR cell's signal is weak to make UE cannot camp on and there is no 3G or 2G neighbour cell; PLMN of NR cell and LTE cell is same;
- The UEs, RAN, AMF, UDM, P-GW+SMF, PGW-U+UPF and other network elements all support the network slicing function;
- The N26 interface between AMF in 5GC and MME in EPC is supported;
- Other configurations could refer to 4.2.4.2 NW 3-5.

UE:

- The configuration could refer to 4.2.4.2 UE 1-3.

Note:

1. If use other Traffic description, the related UE configuration of 4.2.X.2 in which the related TD is used is referred to;
2. For the reference parameters of URSP rules, please see Table 11.

4.3.2.3 Test Procedure

1. UE camps on an LTE cell and sends the Attach Request together with PDN CONNECTIVITY REQUEST. The PDN CONNECTIVITY REQUEST message includes PDU session identity within PCO;

2. NW send the ATTACH ACCEPT message together with an ACTIVATE DEFAULT EPS BEARER CONTEXT REQUEST message to UE. The ACTIVATE DEFAULT EPS BEARER CONTEXT REQUEST message includes PCO message with S-NSSAI-111;
3. UE sends an ATTACH COMPLETE message together with an ACTIVATE DEFAULT EPS BEARER CONTEXT ACCEPT;
4. Start APP2 on the UE, or start an App simulator by appropriate tool;
5. Start APP1 on the UE, or start an App simulator by appropriate tool;
6. Lower LTE cell signal level and raise NR cell signal level to trigger redirection process when the traffic of APP1 and APP2 is ongoing;
7. NW sends RRCConnectionRelease message to UE;
8. UE initiates REGISTRATION REQUEST with registration type “mobility registration updating” in NR;
9. NW sends a REGISTRATION ACCEPT message to UE and the traffic of APP1 and APP2 resumes.

- The UEs, RAN, AMF, UDM, P-GW+SMF, PGW-U+UPF and other network elements all support the network slicing function;
- The N26 interface between AMF in 5GC and MME in EPC is supported;
- Other configurations could refer to 4.2.4.2 NW 3-5.

UE:

- The configuration could refer to 4.2.4.2 UE 1-3.

5 SERVICE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR NETWORK SLICING TRIAL

5.1 FTP/Speedtest Download Service

5.1.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to test whether the network slicing technology can improve the download speed of services that require high throughput, like FTP download or Speedtest Applications and to improve UE download performance of FTP, speedtest services in an overloaded network with a dedicated slice to UE.

5.1.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- Two slices (NSSAI #1 and #2) are configured on gNodeB for same TAC (that Cell A belongs to) and 5GC;
- No dedicated air interface resource (Resource blocks) has been assigned to Slices;
- Two different Subscribed/Allowed/Configured NSSAIs (that are signalled by gNodeB during NG SETUP) are configured for three different USIMs on 5GC. One USIM is assigned to first slice and two USIMs are assigned to second slice;
- 1 IPERF server and 1 FTP server and/or 1 Speedtest server (e.g. Ookla App) and are ready.

UE:

- One test UE with USIM inserted (having S-NSSAI #1) should be ready;
- Two test UE with USIM inserted (having S-NSSAI #2) should be ready;
- The UE states are Switched OFF;
- 3 UEs are located at good radio conditions (e.g. cell-centre).

5.1.3 Test Procedure

1. UE1 registers and sets up a PDU Session on Slice #1 at Cell A;
2. UE2 and UE3 register and set up a PDU Session on Slice #2 at Cell A;
3. UE2 and UE3 start UDP download on Iperf server with full buffer traffic;

- a) Total UDP downlink speed bandwidth can be arranged such that 2 UE UDP traffic covers approximately more than %90 of cell max DL capacity (e.g. 650 Mbps DL UDP to each UE on a 100 MHz BW, 4x4MIMO and 256 QAM C-Band Cell);
- b) In order to create DL UDP traffic, the following iperf commands can be run on IPERF server (e.g. 650 Mbps DL UDP for 60 seconds):

iperf -c <UE2 PDU IP> -u -b 650m -t 60
```

iperf -c <UE3 PDU IP> -u -b 650m -t 60
```
4. UE1 starts downlink FTP or speedtest traffic;
5. Stop all UE traffic;
6. Assign dedicated resources for Slice#1 in Cell A (e.g. some percentage like %50 of RB's) and no dedicated resource for Slice#2;
7. Repeat step 3;
8. Repeat step 4.

5.1.4 Success Criteria

1. After step 4 observe UE1 FTP or Speedtest App DL throughput;
2. After step 8 observe UE1 FTP or Speedtest App DL throughput;
3. Compare the FTP or Speedtest App DL throughputs between step 4 and 8 and observe that the DL throughput after step 8 is much higher.

5.2 Video Service

5.2.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify whether the performance of video service with a dedicated slice on an overloaded network can be improved.

5.2.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- The hardware platform is powered on and the working status is normal;
- The UEs, AMF, UDM and other network elements all support the network slicing function;

- Subscribed S-NSSAIs (S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI111 (default)) are configured for UE1. Network slice S-NSSAI1 is configured for APP1, and no dedicated network slice is configured for APP2 in UE1;
- No dedicated network slice is configured for UE2 and UE3;
- Assign dedicated resources for S-NSSAI1 (e.g. some percentage like 50% of RB's), and no dedicated resource is assigned for S-NSSAI111;
- The network is overloaded. The overloaded network is constructed according to 5.1.3 step 3;
- A signalling analysis tool and packet capture environment have been created on the AMF and N3 (UPF).

UE:

- The UE1 is switched on;
- At least two video service APPs can be implemented in the UE1. APP1 can match URSP rule-1 with APPID-1. APP2 cannot match any URSP rules except the default URSP rule (with match-all traffic descriptor) with APP ID-2;
- APP1 in UE1 can be implemented in dedicated slice S-NSSAI1. APP2 in UE1 can be implemented in default slice S-NSSAI111;
- UE2 and UE3 can be implemented in default slice S-NSSAI111.

5.2.3 Test Procedure

1. Step 2-4 in 4.2.1.3 are performed;
2. The NW sends a DL NAS transport message to UE1 including the payload containers and MANAGE UE POLICY COMMAND message which contains the URSP configured by the PCF. A PDU Session to the default DNN using the default S-NSSAI is established;
3. Start the video service APP2 on the UE1;
4. Start the video service APP1 on the UE1;
5. Split the screen of UE1 for APP1 and APP2, so that two APPs can be displayed on the screen at the same time.

5.2.4 Success Criteria

Step 3: APP2 video service can be implemented normally in default network slice S-NSSAI111. Observe the latency t_2 of APP2 video service;

Step 4: APP1 video service can be implemented normally in network slice S-NSSAI1. Observe the latency t_1 of APP1 video service;

Step 5: Compare the performance of APP1 and APP2, the video performance of APP1 is better than APP2, i.e. video of APP1 is smoother than APP2, and no buffering is required for APP1. The latency of these two services is $t_1 < t_2$.

5.3 Cloud Gaming Service

5.3.1 Test Objective

The purpose of this test case is to verify whether the performance of cloud gaming service with a dedicated slice on an overloaded network can be improved.

5.3.2 Pre-configuration

NW:

- 5GC Cell A belongs to Home PLMN;
- The hardware platform is powered on and the working status is normal;
- The UEs, AMF, UDM and other network elements all support the network slicing function;
- Subscribed S-NSSAIs (S-NSSAI1, S-NSSAI111 (default)) are configured for UE1. Network slice S-NSSAI1 is configured for APP1, and no dedicated network slice is configured for APP2 in UE1;
- No dedicated network slice is configured for UE2 and UE3;
- Assign dedicated resources for S-NSSAI1 (e.g. some percentage like 50% of RB's), and no dedicated resource is assigned for S-NSSAI111;
- The network is overloaded. The overloaded network is constructed according to 5.1.3 step 3;
- A signalling analysis tool and packet capture environment have been created on the AMF and N3 (UPF).

UE:

- The UE1 is switched on;
- At least two cloud gaming service APPs can be implemented in the UE1. APP1 can match URSP rule-1 with APPID-1. APP2 cannot match any URSP rules except the default URSP rule (with match-all traffic descriptor) with APP ID-2;
- APP1 in UE1 can be implemented in dedicated slice S-NSSAI1. APP2 in UE1 can be implemented in default slice S-NSSAI111;
- UE2 and UE3 can be implemented in default slice S-NSSAI111.

5.3.3 Test Procedure

1. Step 2-4 in 4.2.1.3 are performed;
2. The NW sends a DL NAS transport message to UE1 including the payload containers and MANAGE UE POLICY COMMAND message which contains the URSP configured by the PCF. A PDU Session to the default DNN using the default S-NSSAI is established;
3. Start the cloud gaming service APP2 on the UE1;
4. Start the cloud gaming service APP1 on the UE1;
5. Split the screen of UE1 for APP1 and APP2, so that two APPs can be displayed on the screen at the same time.

5.3.4 Success Criteria

Step 3: APP2 cloud gaming service can be implemented normally in default network slice S-NSSAI111. Observe the latency t_2 of APP2 cloud gaming service;

Step 4: APP1 cloud gaming service can be implemented normally in network slice S-NSSAI1. Observe the latency t_1 of APP1 cloud gaming service;

Step 5: Compare the cloud gaming service of APP1 and APP2, the user experience of APP1 is better than APP2, i.e. the service is not stuck and no buffering is required for APP1. The latency of these two services is $t_1 < t_2$.
